DIY Wooden Raised Garden Bed




Why: To improve gardening success.

Where: You can install it in any old gardens: 3100, 3160, 3234, 3161, 3191, 3251, 3271

How:

Redwood and cedar are best, as they are rot and water-resistant but they can be more expensive. Reedwood can be purchased nearby at Anawalt Lumber. Take the measurements of the wooden boundary of your garden. You can build a garden bed that is this size or smaller. 6 to 8 inches in height is enough for the raised bed. Explain the project to the employee in the lumber department if you need more assistance. Then all you need to do is nail it together. Fill with organic soil+compost mix. Amend soil every season.
